Post-Results Information for Students

Each Examination Board offers a Post-Results Service following the issuing of your results.

The Exams Office produces a leaflet detailing the services available and related fees, which is placed in the results envelopes of all A2 students. As AS students access results on-line. The leaflet is also placed on our Moodle site and paper copies are also available from the Exams Office, and Reception.

AS & A2 Grades

If you are concerned about your exam result, we recommend that you contact your subject teacher or the Head of Department to discuss your result on Results Day if possible, otherwise at your earliest opportunity to seek advice over what to do next.

Students completing their Programme of Study and seeking university places, please ensure that you will be available on Results Day, because if your results have not quite met your university offer there are two priority services offered for you to have your script(s) remarked or a photocopy returned. The Exams Office will help you with this process and the necessary documents are available to download from our Moodle site. Please also speak to our Student Guidance Team if your university place is at risk.

Remark requests need to be carefully considered as the grade could possibly go down as well as up.

Other Post-Result services available to AS & A2 students include non-priority remarks, original scripts, clerical checks and late cash-in opportunities.

Please be aware that there are submission deadlines for Post-Results services, which are detailed on our Post-Results Leaflet.

GCSE Grades

Post-Result services for GCSE's are more restricted to remark requests and original scripts. Please seek advice from your subject teacher in the first instance and then the Exams Office can help you with your requests.

Remark requests need to be carefully considered as the grade could possibly go down as well as up.

Vocational Results

Post-Results services typically apply only to vocational programmes of study that have also a written exam as part of the qualification. Otherwise, grades are agreed at moderation of the units completed during the course. Please see your subject teacher if you have any query with your overall grade.
